Proposals

<u>Motion 1:</u> The Clean & Green Committee recommends to approve funding not to exceed **\$5,000** from line item **2.02 (Landscaping)** for Christy Webber to replace two trees on Damen Ave. (23-0101)

Updates

- 1. MT proposed strategically promoting green initiatives/SSA information to people waiting in line for Supreme, as they're a captive audience.
- 2. AH proposed inviting David Oakes from the Andersonville Chamber of Commerce and SSA #22 to discuss their commercial composting program at next month's meeting as we develop RFP's for interested companies (WasteNot, Block Bins, etc.) that could manage the initiative.
- AH and LS are tasked with a Spring survey of furniture (bike racks, benches, etc.) and planter fencing along division, to then report to Americana Iron Works if any refurbishments need to be made.
- 4. Third party charging stations were brought into question by WJ as the committee solidifies sustainability rebate to include EV charging stations and rain barrel access in the SSA.
- 5. WJ proposed collaboration between the Chamber and SSA for the "10 things to be green" sustainability certification, where the Chamber can provide contacts for viable businesses and SSA representatives can investigate if they meet the sustainability requirements and provide a sustainability fulfillment sticker for their storefront.
- 6. Chi and MT proposed more promotion of Cleanslate practices and successes in marketing materials and social media, highlighting the good that the program does within the community and all over the city.
- 7. WJ recommends revisiting the CW contract to make sure they are contracted to clean under the tree grates on Division, as they are not doing so currently.
