Motion 1: The Transportation Committee moves to approve funding not to exceed \$7,000 from line item 2.05 (Streetscape Elements) for the purchase and installation of up to 14 planters from Doty & Sons and \$7,000 from line item 2.02 (Landscaping) for landscaping services provided by Christy Webber for planters along Damen Ave. pedestrian bump-outs. (23-0603)

MH motions. WJ seconds. All in favor. Motion passes.

<u>Motion 2</u>: The Transportation Committee moves to approve funding not to exceed **\$9,000** from line item **3.04 (Bicycle Transit Enhancements)** for the purchase of 3 bike corrals from Dero to be installed within the boundaries of SSA #33. (23-0604)

Discussion: AH clarified that the corrals would be installed along Division.

<u>Motion 3:</u> The Transportation Committee moves to approve funding not to exceed \$3,000 from line item 5.04 (Bicycle Safety Programs) for Jogalite to produce 1,000 branded, reflective leg bands. (23-0605)

Motion 4: The Clean & Green Committee recommends to approve funding not to exceed **\$85,000** from line item **2.11 (Sidewalk Snow Plowing)** for Christy Webber Landscaping to service all boundaries of the SSA for the 2023-24 winter season. (23-0601)

<u>Motion 7:</u> The Arts Committee recommends to approve funding not to exceed \$40,000 from line item 2.06 (Public Art) for a mosaic installation by Greenstar Movement along the viaduct at Milwaukee/Leavitt as reviewed in 2022. (23-0607)
