- 1. 8 Chicago Sculpture Exhibit Sponsorships
 - a. Installation and reception have been very smooth
- 2. Wronski mural was completed over the summer to great neighborhood reception
- 3. Brantley mural recently went under a restoration, with an anti-graffiti coat in the works

<u>Motion 1:</u> The Arts Committee motions to approve funding not to exceed \$10,000 from line item 2.06 (Public Art) of the 2024 budget year to purchase the Transmigration sculpture from artist Jyl Bonaguro. (23-0906)

Discussion: JM shared that the sculpture would be weather-protected for 5-10 years, with Metzger Court being its most likely location.

<u>Motion 2:</u> The Arts Committee motions to approve funding not to exceed \$5,000 from line item 2.06 (Public Art) for the purchase of anti-graffiti clear-coat; covering the cost of the Brantley mural as well as additional supplies for other artists and SSA-sponsored murals in the neighborhood.  - a. The committee discussed the best locations for the proposed Green Star mural, including the side of Gallery Café, Royal Palms Chicago, and the alley near The Goddess and Grocer.

6. Gallery Walk Brainstorm
